

Exodus 1-12 selections

## EXODUS 1:6-17

A new king comes into power who doesn't know Joseph. He fears the ever-growing Hebrew population, so he made their lives bitter. Ultimately - as a control measure - he decreed that all the Hebrew boys born were to be killed.

## CHAPTER 2

At 3 mos. hidden in the reeds. Discovered by Pharoah's daughter. Nursed by his own mom, but raised as the son of Pharoah's daughter.

As a man, killed an Egyptian he saw beating a Hebrew. Fearing Pharoah's wrath, he fled to Midian where he met and married a wife and settled down, tending his FIL's sheep. Meanwhile, life is getting ugly for his people in Egypt (vss. 23-25)



## CHAPTER 3

A right view of God (Vss. 1-6) necessarily preceded  
the Call of God (Vs. 10)

Vss. 11-14 Moses' hesitation and God's assurance

## CHAPTER 4

God equips Moses with miraculous signs to authenticate his mission before Pharaoh.

Moses fearfully spits and sputters until God, although very angry with Moses, provides Aaron as a spokesperson to join Moses before Pharaoh.

Moses returns to Egypt and strengthens the hearts of the Israelites

## CHAPTER 5

Moses' command to Pharoah goes as expected and life gets even harder for the children of Israel.

As a result, they cry out against Moses (5:21) and Moses cries out to God (Vss. 22-23)

“You have not rescued Your people at all.”  
It's hard sometimes to wait on God, isn't it?



## CHAPTERS 7-11

Rescue is coming, but not before many plagues come upon Egypt. Pharaoh's heart is repeatedly hardened against God and his refusal results in plague after plague.

Of note: Several plagues affected only Egyptian households.

Each plague directly defied a 'god' in Egypt, proving them powerless.

Very detailed instructions 1-11, incl. “the blood... on the sides and tops of the doorframes of the houses...”

Vs. 12 Judgement is coming to all who were not covered by the blood of the lamb.
