Vss. 13-15 Famine severe. Money gone. Vss. 16-18 Livestock now legal tender while it lasts. Soon all that remains is their land and their bodies. Vss. 20-21 Slaves in Egypt. But alive!

Vss. 23-27 Hope restored

CHAPTERS 48-49

Blessing of Ephraim and Manasseh who are to be counted as Jacob's own (48:5)

Blessing of Jacob's own sons. Of note: 49:8-11 (See also Rev. 5:5)

49:22-26 Faithfulness rewarded

CHAPTER 50 Vss. 12-13 Jacob dies (49:33) and is buried in Canaan, as promised in 47:29-30

Vss. 15-21 Joseph's incredible focus on God and His work allows forgiveness of many sins against him

Vss. 24-26 "God will surely come to your aid" The death of Joseph (vs. 26)
